### Assumptions

- Stagnant wages affect the ability to secure transportation, afford safe housing, obtain quality childcare, and treat mental/physical health issues.
- Structural inequities impact access to housing, education, food, health care, employment, and social capital.
- Low education levels suppress upward social and economic mobility.
- The lack of social capital (support systems) is a barrier to economic mobility.
- Social determinants of health impact economic mobility.
