

A message from our President...

My relationship with Tri County Community Action has come nearly full circle. I initially became involved just as the organization was beginning the important work of transitioning from just providing emergency services, to instead providing long-term self-sufficiency programming. Helping people to get out of poverty and become self-sustaining were the hallmarks of social services at that time, and they continue to be today, more than twenty years after I first started working with the agency.

Since that time years ago, I have held the privilege of serving many roles, including my most recent, as the President of the Board of Directors. It was during my tenure as President that we began rotating our meetings to convene in each county of our service area. Tri County Community Action carries a large footprint and it encompasses urban, rural, and suburban communities.

As our meetings alternated throughout the region, what became apparent to me, and to all of us, is that we have so many things in common but yet, we recognize that self-sufficiency is a 'mixed bag', and no two people are entirely the same. Because of that, every family and individual needs the tools to reach the goals that are most important to them. Recognizing this, I'm proud that Tri County Community Action was able to respond to the changing needs in our different communities by implementing our new S.T.A.R.T. initiative, Bridges 4 Life program, and expansion of our Neighborhood Revitalization activities. Tri County Community Action is one of the few agencies able to work in all three counties providing those much needed services and the necessary tools for families and individuals to make decisions and goals for their own lives.




Congratulations to the Tri County Community Action Board of Directors, and especially, to the staff for their hard work and dedication in making it happen.






